He graduated from Lowell High School in 1961 and attended Western Baptist Bible College for one year then transferred to Pillsbury Baptist Bible College where he graduated in 1961. Ed then pursued selling insurance until he joined Frontier Airlines in 1969 as a ticket agent. He worked for Frontier in various positions over the years. When Frontier shut down in 1986, Ed embarked on a new career working for Swisher of Co (selling toilet cleaning services to various companies) until he landed his next airline job with Trans Colorado, then Aspen Airways and finally America West Airlines. We always said the airline business was in his blood. He loved working for the airlines. During his time with Aspen, he lived in Saudi Arabia for 5 months as a Project Manager with Saudi Aramco. His next big achievement was as a founder of the current Frontier Airlines. He worked for the "new" Frontier from 1994 until 1996. His career path then lead him to General Electric working as a dispatcher. He stayed with GE until he retired in his mid 70's, stayed home for 6 months then went back to GE as a contract worker and worked part time until he was 80. He just finally retired about 3 weeks ago.

Ed met Susan at an airline party in 1975. They were married on March 7, 1976. They were married for 48 yrs and 1 week. On July 11, 1979 they welcomed Courtney Joy and on June 2, 1981 Graeme Jay was born. The family lived in Aurora Co until Ed was transferred to Phoenix as the Station Manager for Frontier Airlines in 1996. Once the kids turned 5 they entered the soccer world with both kids playing through high school. During that time Ed became active in soccer as a soccer referee, referee assigner and also served on the Colorado State Youth Soccer Association board. Upon moving to

Phoenix in 1995, Ed continued to referee for a few more years. With the encouragement of family friends, Ed became involved in the BBQ world and became a certified BBQ judge in 2009 and moved on to be a Master Judge in 2013. His final BBQ competition was Jan 2024 which marked 59 BBQ competitions Ed had judged in over 15 yrs.

Ed always enjoyed traveling and before the kids were born, Ed and Susan traveled extensively. They discovered cruising back in 2005 and usually took at least one cruise yearly. Mexico was another favorite place to vacation. Ed's grandest joy was his grandchildren, Ashlen McNabb 14, Dakota Quisenberry 14, Dalton Quisenberry 12, Collin McNabb 11 and Conor McNabb 8. Ed enjoyed going to their softball, baseball and soccer games, music concerts and school programs.

Ed had a full life giving us many memories to hold on to as we adjust to his absence. He was often described as gentle, honest, hard- working, someone with a good sense of humor and one who loved his family. He was loved by all he came in contact with. He loved watching the news, movies, and playing games. Ed was a loving husband, dad and grandfather. He will be greatly missed, and even though his earthly body is gone, we know he will be watching from heaven.
