OBITUARY: Emily Hanrahan Howell Warner, October 30,



1939 - July 3, 2020, passed away on July 3, 2020. She was preceded in death by son Stanley, husband Julius, brother Jack and his wife Jan.

Her surviving family members are brother Dennis Hanrahan (Jeane), brother Miles (Pat) Hanrahan (Delores), and brother Richard (Dick) Hanrehan; sister Eileen Hanrahan Spillane. She also is survived by several stepchildren and their children: John and Carre Warner, David and Kris Warner, Julia and Paul (Cook), Elizabeth and Joe

(Cowan), and Suzanne (Hagen).

Emily was born on October 30, 1939, in Denver, Colorado, and graduated from Holy Family High School. At 16, and before learning to drive, Emily embarked on a journey that would earn her a place in history and empower women all over the world to follow their dreams.

As a young woman, Emily bought a ticket on Frontier Airlines to visit a friend working in Gunnison, Colorado. During that trip, she was invited into the cockpit to look around, and from that moment, was hooked. She knew she no longer wanted to be a passenger, and she wanted to fly! After that first trip, Emily asked her parents if she could take flying lessons. The Hanrahan's, had six children and could not provide Emily with her coveted flying lessons. Emily, always determined, said, "Don't worry, I will pay for the lessons myself." Both parents agreed,

And that is how her now-famous career began. Emily's brother Dennis would take her out to Clinton Aviation for lessons because Emily, though 16, did not have a driver's license. Emily remained close to her siblings and continued to fly. Jack and Dennis purchased homes in the same complex together to raise their children and support Emily and her son, Stanley, as she pursued her aviation dream. She became the chief pilot and FAA inspector for Clinton Aviation.

Emily's students consisted of many of the male airline pilots that ended up flying for commercial airlines. While Emily could teach other pilots how to fly, she would be denied the same job

In January of 1973, Frontier Airlines hired Emily, making her the first woman in the United States to be hired by a commercial airline to fly.

Emily, you will be missed by all of your beloved family, friends, and associates. Our consolation is now we know you are Weaving the Winds and Flying with the Angels.

Emily Warner will be honored at Wings Over the Rockies Museum at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, July 17, 2020.

Some years back I was doing some research in the archive book section of Brigham Young University. In reading about the old airmail pilots who flew the transcontinental mail between the years of 1918 and 1927, I came across an article explaining the term "Gone West."

As the old airmail route continued its expansion from the east coast to the west, thirty-two pilots and nine mechanics lost their lives in the line of duty. Three hundred wrecked aircraft were strewn from the Allegheny Mountains known as "The Hell Stretch," across the open plains to the Rockies, the Wasatch, the Sierras into the west coast. When a pilot was over due, the term "Gone West" came into being.

Located in the former Rocky Mountain Airways airline terminal of Granby/Grand County Airport, the museum's displays, photographs and artifacts tell the fascinating stories of aviation history in Grand County.

History-The airport building at 1023 County Road 610 in Granby was the original airline terminal for Rocky Mountain Airways (RMA).

Built in 1973, it notably is modeled after the Vail Bell Tower. The RMA terminal was built by the Dell Webb Corporation which also developed the Innsbruck/Silver Creek Ski Area of Granby.

Many historic artifacts and information about Emily Warner are on display. In 1976, Warner became America's first, female airline captain.

She also developed Ouray Ranch on the Colorado River near Granby and lived in Grand County for over 25 years.


