George W. Wilson

Funeral services were held on Saturday, Oct. 20, 2001, for George W. Wilson, 78, of Clifton, Texas in the Lawson Funeral Home Chapel in Meridian, Texas with the Rev. G.W. McDowell and Rev. Van Gladen officiating.

Wilson was born on Jan. 11, 1923, near Iredell, Texas. He was the son of the late Silas A. and Lorena Willingham Wilson.

He died on Thursday, Oct. 18, 2001, at his residence after an extended illness. He finished school in Iredell, Texas. On July 13, 1942, he was united in marriage to Dorothy N. Jaehne in Fort Worth, Texas.

In October of that year, he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and served in World War II and Korea. After his discharge, he and his wife lived in Fort Worth where he worked for General Dynamics.

He later was employed with Central Airlines, later known as Frontier Airlines, as a aviation mechanical inspector.

Wilson retired in 1983, after more than 42 years in the aircraft industry, and moved from Denver, Colorado to Clifton, Texas.

He was a member of the Spring Creek Baptist Church and the Clifton Masonic Lodge.
