Harry Cutler, 70, a resident of Montrose since 1947, died Sunday afternoon, July 24, 1994, in the Valley Manor Care Center at Montrose.

Memorial Services to honor Mr. Cutler's life will be officiated by the Rev. John Petty on Wednesday, July 27, at 2 p.m. from the Montrose Zion Lutheran Church. The service will conclude at the church.

Harry Cutler, the son of Arthur Howard and Mary Alice (Russell) Cutler, was born on Oct. 22, 1923, in Fruita, Colo., where he spent his childhood, graduated from the Fruita High School, and grew to adulthood.

Mr. Cutler worked for the Southern Pacific Railroad until joining the service.

During World War II, he served his country as a member of the United States Navy.

In 1977, Mr. Cutler married Marion Kail in Montrose. He was previously married to Fay Moore in 1949, with this marriage later ending in divorce.

Mr. Cutler moved to Montrose in 1947 where he was employed with Monarch Airlines, which later became Frontier Airlines. He received his pilot's license in 1947 and after 25 years of service he retired from Frontier Airlines.

For a short time Mr. Cutler was employed with the Montrose County Airport. He then began his employment in the flight department with Colorado-Ute, leaving from the company after 15 years of service.

He is survived by his wife, Marion Cutler, of Montrose; two sons, Maurice Cutler and wife, Sallie, Marshall Cutler, all of Montrose; two stepsons, Randy Kail and wife, Debbie, of Cheyenne, Wyo.; Brian Kail and wife, Jackie, of Farmington, N.M.; four daughters, Renice and husband Rob Lake, Rogene and husband Donald Seeverz, all of Montrose; Nanette and husband Rhey Wright, of Ft. Collins; Lynnae and husband Pat Whitehead, of Kirkland, Ariz.; two stepdaughters, Lori and husband Ronnie Deltondo, of Montrose; Linda Hunt, of Rockford, Ill.; 18 grandchildren; and one great-grandchild.

Other family survivors include two brothers: Charles Cutler, of Canon City; Edward Cutler, of Santa Maria, Calif.; and his twin sister, Harriett Blau, of Alexandria, Va.

In addition to his parents, Mr. Cutler was also preceded in death by one daughter, Jeanine Cutler; two brothers: Hobert Cutler and Paul Cutler; and one sister, Vera Cutler.

He was an active member of the Montrose Zion Lutheran Church and a member of the Montrose Elks Lodge No. 1053, B.P.O.E.

Upon his retirement, Mr. Cutler very much enjoyed his grandchildren, his time working around the property, riding his horses, hiking, and taking steam railroad trips.
