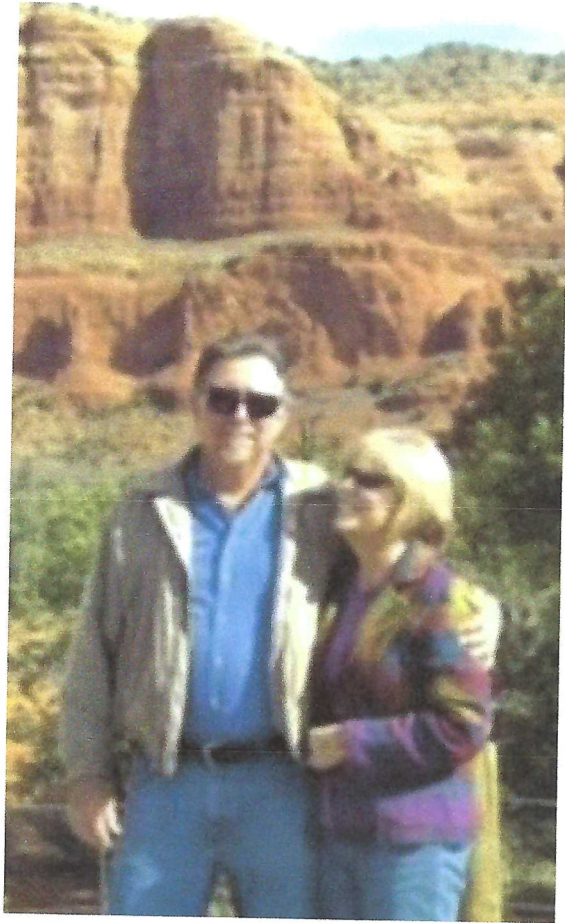

Jacalyn Mary Riddle Power, 75, passed away unexpectedly on January 16, 2024 due to medical complications. She passed peacefully with her husband, daughter, and a best friend by her side.
