Kenneth Eugene Schultz

Kenneth E. Schultz was born Aug. 19, 1930 in Denver to Emil and Sophia nee Bongers Schultz. He passed away at home in Wheat Ridge on May 2, 2010. He is survived by his beloved wife, Ruth; son, Gregory; stepchildren, Karen Chapin (Fred), Erik Kahre, Mark (Leigh) Kahre, and Gretchen (Chris) Holland; grandchildren, Emma and Jack Schultz; step-grandchildren, Viktoria and Alexandra Sylvester; and brother, Glenn. He was predeceased by his parents; brother, Earl, and sister, Gloria Frey.

He attended Emmaus Lutheran School from 1935-1943, was confirmed at Emmaus Lutheran Church in 1943, and graduated from North High School in 1947. He earned his aviation mechanic's license at a very early age and worked for various airlines as a mechanic and eventually became an airline maintenance supervisor.

He was a faithful member of a number of different Missouri Synod Lutheran Churches and served on many boards and committees. At times he held the offices of congregation president and vice president. He was a member of the Colorado Lutheran Chorale and was frequently a member of his church choir.

Ken was an avid fan and member of the Frontier Retirement Club and had an extensive collection of airline memorabilia. He wrote extensive histories of the original Frontier Airlines and other various associated airlines. He made numerous generous donations of items to the Denver Public Library, the Colorado History Museum, Wings over the Rockies, and many other places.

He had a great interest in genealogy and helped prepare the genealogical information about the Schultz family that is posted in the Schultz room of the Bavarian Inn in Frankenmuth, Michigan.

At one time he was an avid barbwire collector and made a number of donations to various barbwire museums.

He was a member of Die Pommerschen Leute, AHSGR, the Frontier Retirement Club, the Colorado Historical Society, and the Colorado Aviation Society. He taught himself to read the old German script so that he could do his own research in the old German Church Books.
